# Calamian Deer (Axis camaliensis) Status and Conservation





#### **Historical Distribution**

Found in the Calamian Island Group of the Palawan Faunal Region

Fossil evidence that the species was found on Palawan 7,000 years ago



#### **Current Distribution**

Now found only on two islands:

Culion and Busuanga

Estimated population ~ 1,300



### **Culion Island Population**

Recent Occupancy Survey Conducted in 2017-2018

8 potential habitat sites surveyed


4 of 8 sites showed evidence of deer

### Calauit Game Preserve History

Formed in 1976 by Former President Marcos

Removed all inhabitants from the peninsula

Imported giraffe(15), zebra(15), waterbuck(12), topi(10), bushbuck(12) impala(18), gazelle(11) and eland(11)

Small population of Calamian deer existed

Deer population thrived to an estimated high of 2,000

Fall of Marcos in 1986

Former inhabitants returned and started hunting deer and African anima

### Calauit Game Preserve History



- Deer population declined
- Eventually protection of the Core Area of the Preserve was put in place
- Outside the Core Area the land is disputed and hunting rampant
- Giraffe (22), zebra (~20) and small number of eland and waterbuck

### Threats to the Calauit Population

Uncertainty of land ownership

Hunting outside core area of the GP

Development of the Game Preserve (includes coastal development)

Disease from African ungulates and livestock
